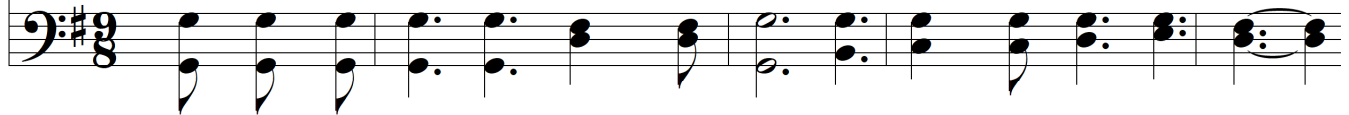


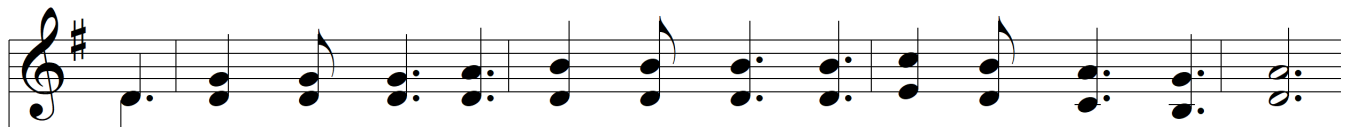
O for a Thousand Tongues to Sing
